



This is the letter "u." The letter "u" says, "uh," like in up, under and umbrella.




The letter "u" looks like an upside down letter "n" —




The letter "n" says "nnn" and the letter "u" says "uh."

Although the letter "u" is at the beginning of some words, most of the time you will find the letter "u" in the middle of a word:




Let's use our hands to make the letter "u":




And what does the letter "u" say? ("uh").


One day, when Sid and ham are having a nice CUP of tea, Sid realizes that he hasn't seen or talked with SiS for a long time.

Sid. "What are you doing there?"




SiS doesn't answer. In


fact, SiS doesn't move at

all. "Uh, oh," says sid.


"I think SiS is sick."

"Let me see if the doctor is in." The rabbit puts a sock on his head. "Yes, the doctor will be right over."




Two minutes later,

sid opens the door.


"Oh, no, not you again.

"That animal is sick."




"Iam?" asks ham.

"Very sick," says the rabbit.


"You need to drink a CUP of my special medicine."




The rabbit pours some medicine in a cup and gives it to ham.

"Drink it up, up, up, up."




ham grabs the cup

Up, Up."




ham takes another

sip from the cup.


"Ewwww. Now I really

feel sick."




"Well, you aren't sick," says Sid. "SiS is sick."

Sid points. "The mouse over there."


"That is not a mouse," says the rabbit. "That is an elephant."



The rabbit pokes SIS.


"A bit small for an elephant, but very sick.

"Hey!" says the rabbit.


"This elephant doesn't have a mouth. I will have to put the thermometer in my own mouth."




"Oh, my gosh!" says the rabbit. "I have a fever.

Quick! Where is the CUP?"


The rabbit drinks all the soap in the CUP.




The rabbit burps, and a hundred bubbles come out of his mouth. He floats UP, UP and out the window.

in the sky.






"Hey, hey," says **SIS**.
