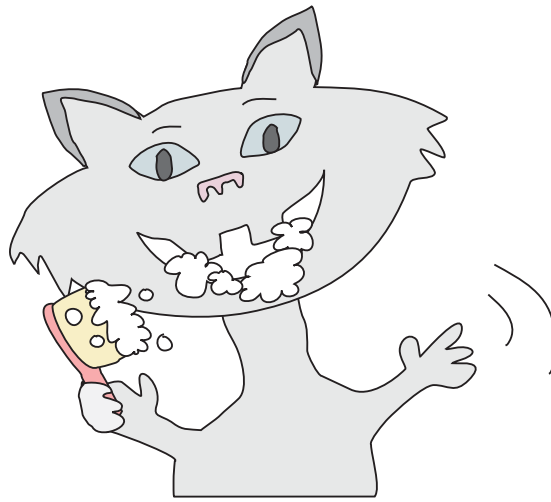

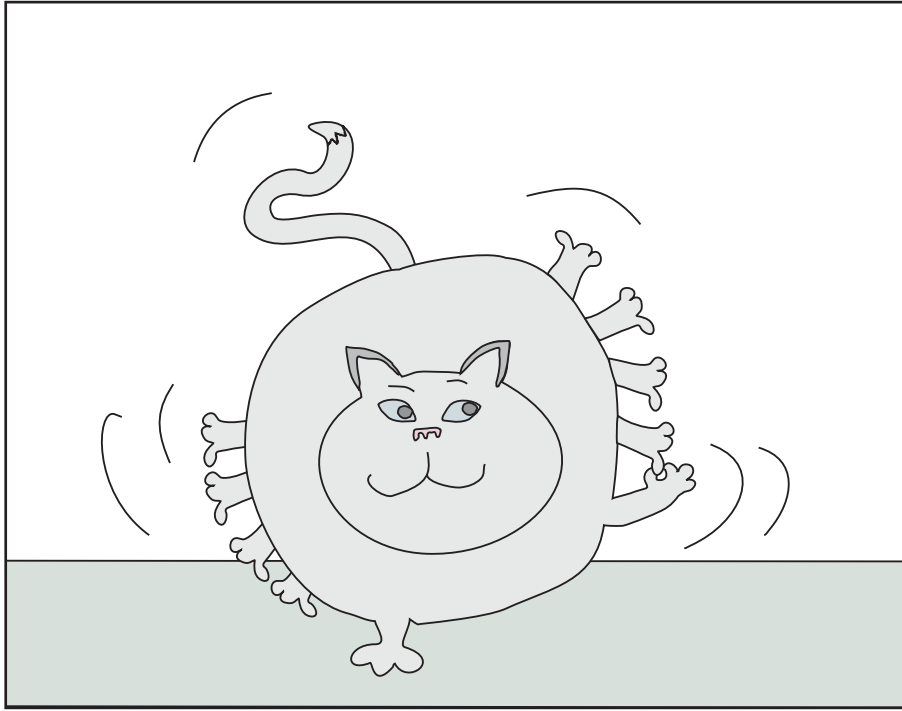

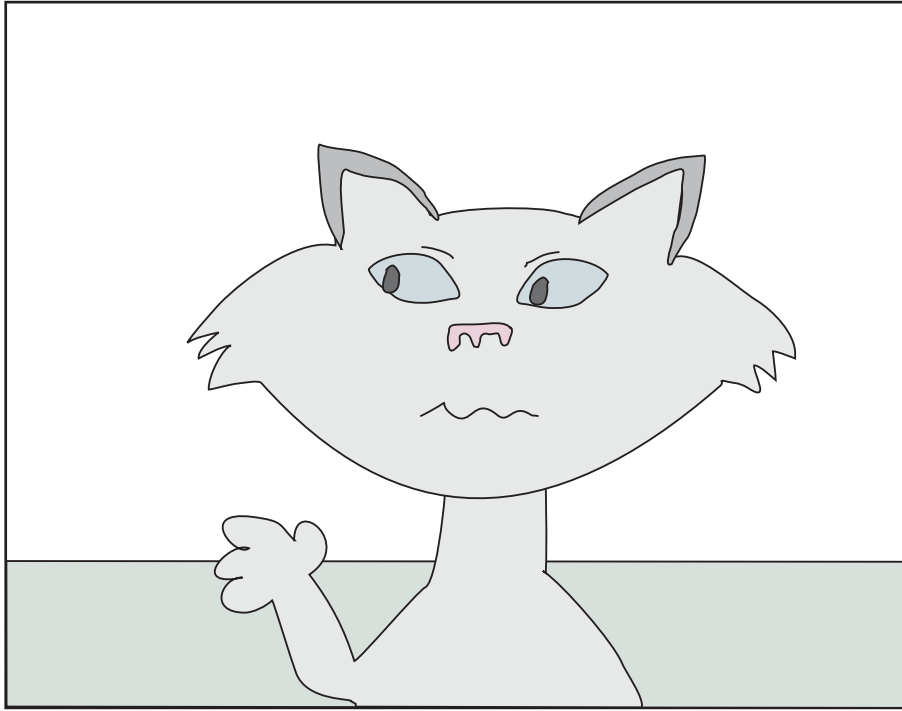


“Counting feet is

nine... **ten**.”



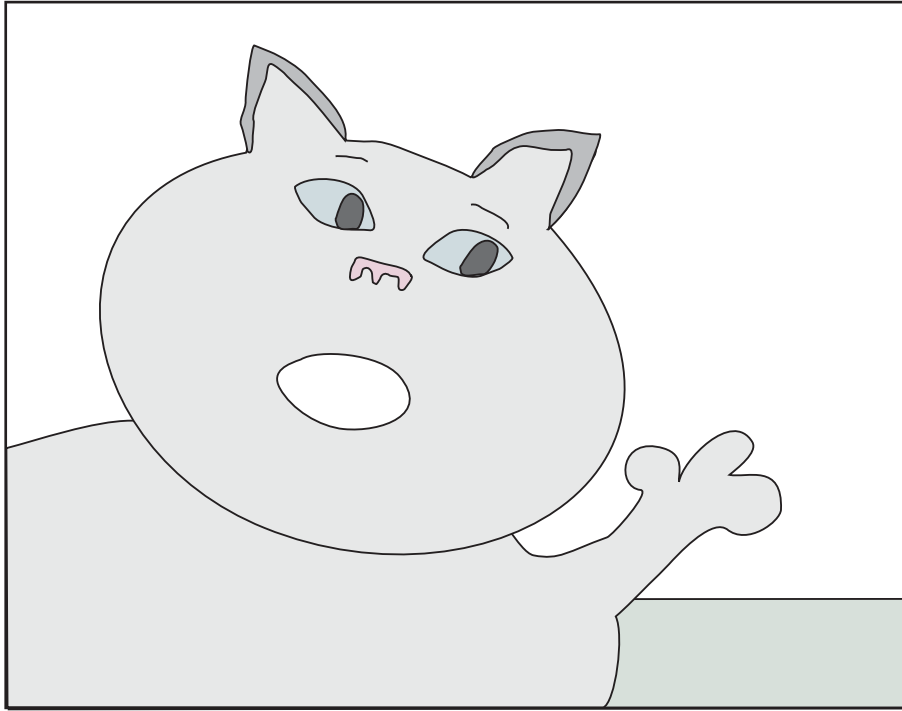
“Silly **cat**,” says **tim**.

feet?”

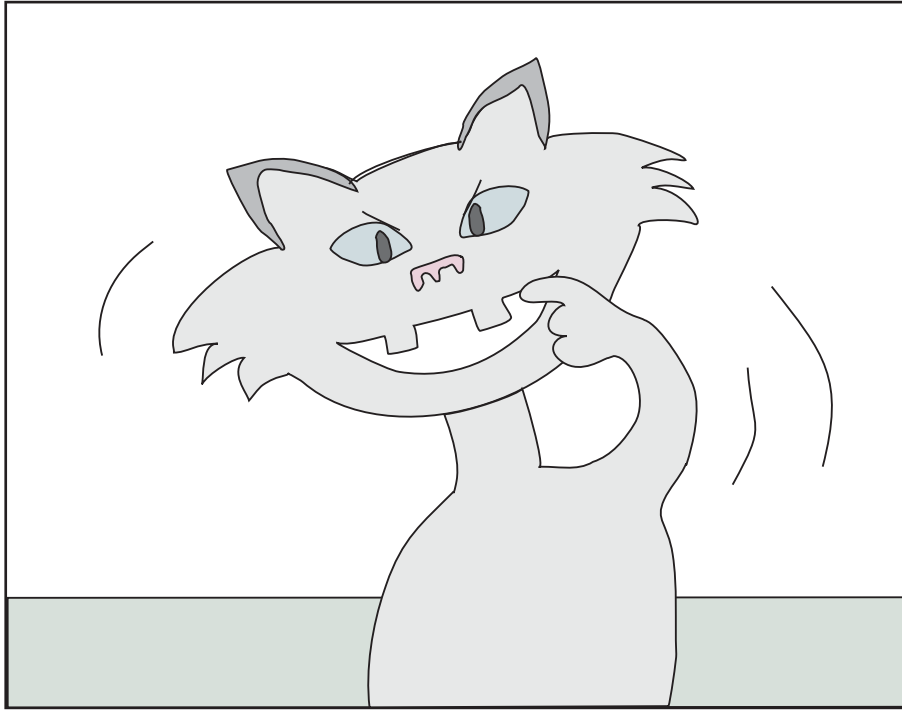


“You like your teeth more

it would be **fun**.”



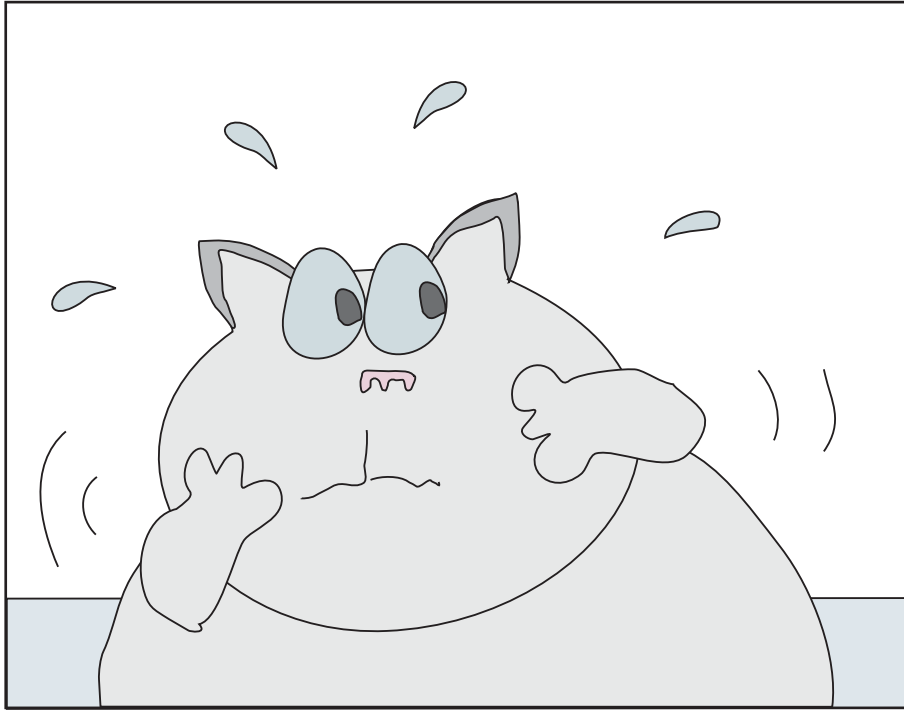
“Okay, okay,” says **tim**,

fun.”

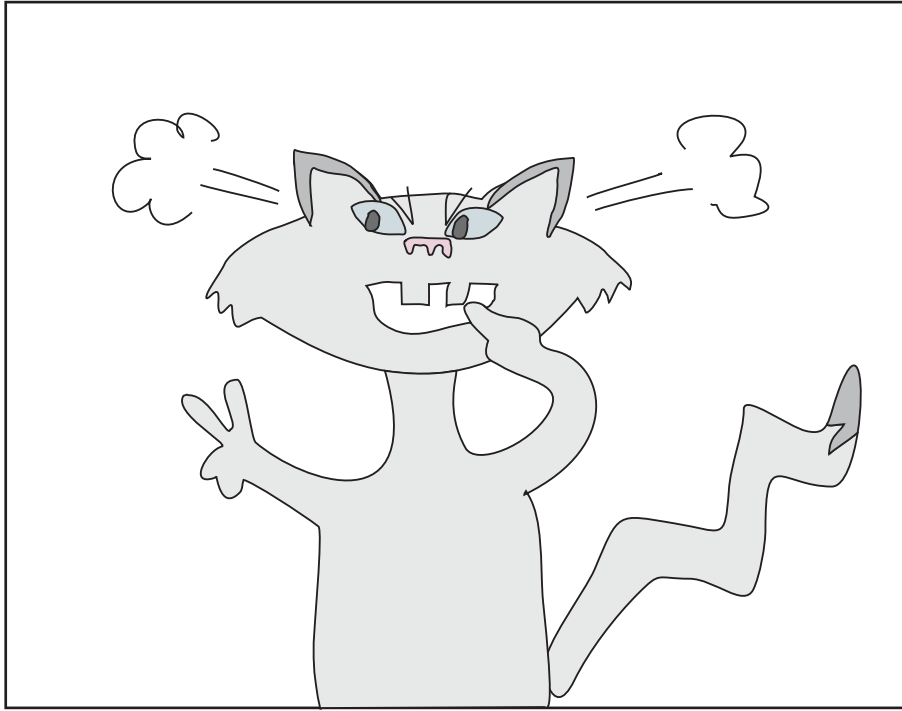


“One tooth?” says **tom**.

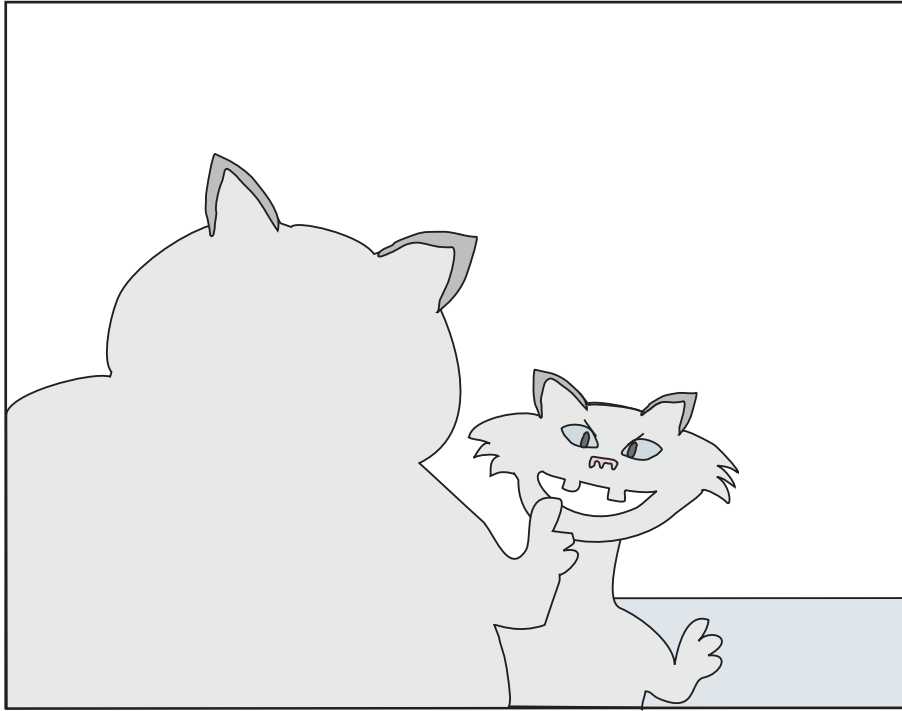
You have just ONE

them yourself.”



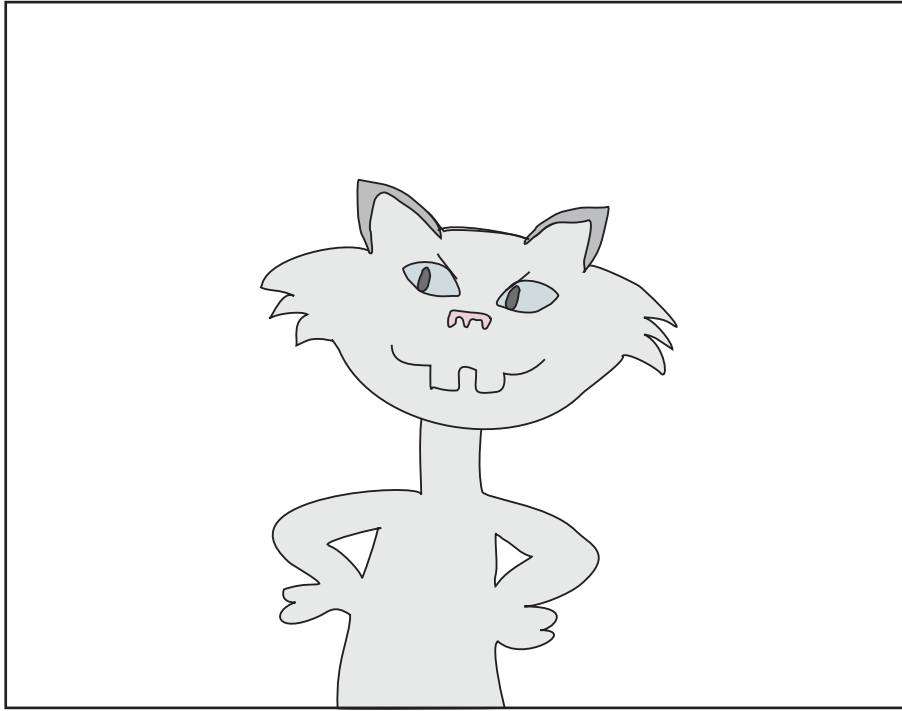
tom counts his

brother's teeth. "One...

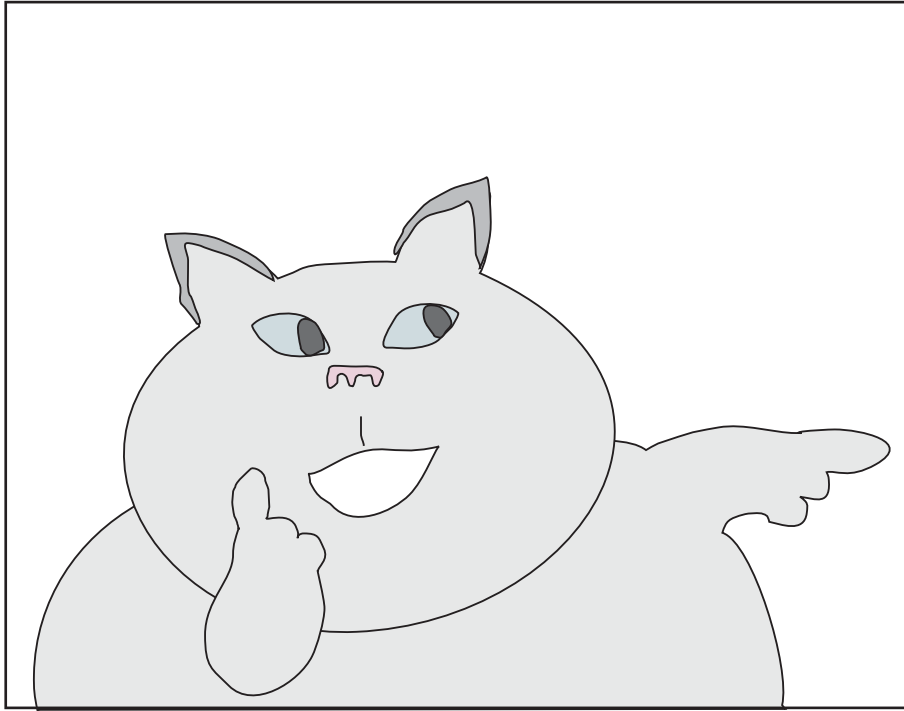
eight... four... ten...

Yes, you have two

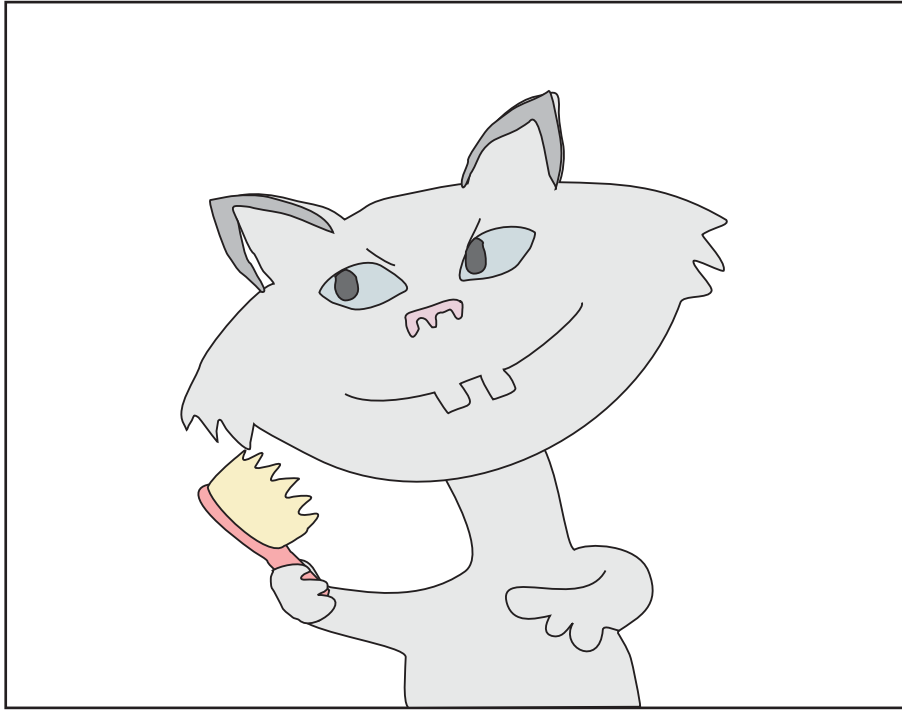
teeth."



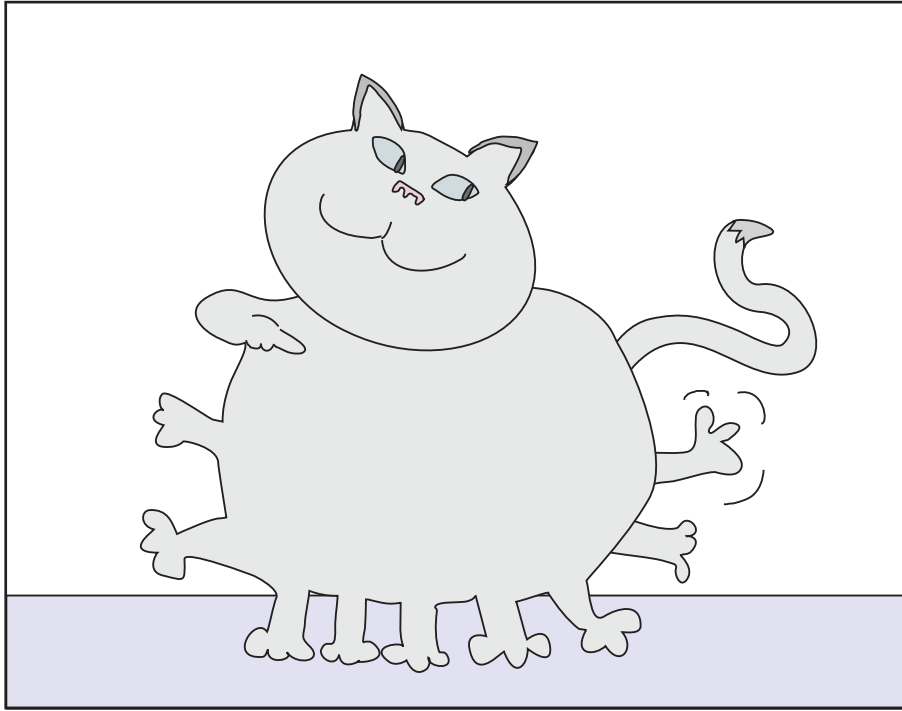
“**I** told you so,” says

my feet. Okay?”



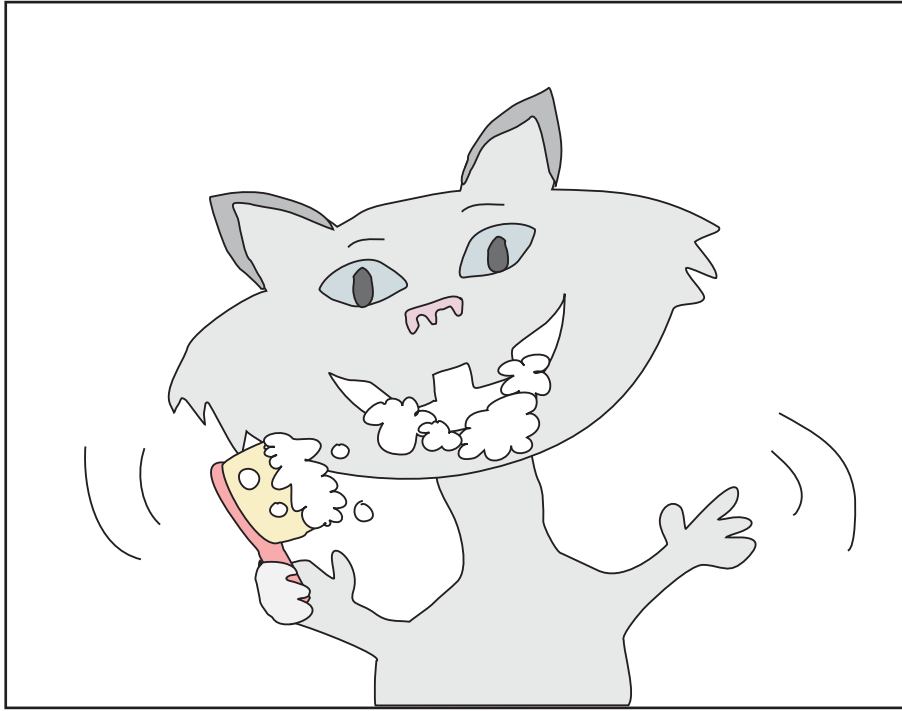
“I am ready,” says
