
This is the letter 'j.' The letter 'j' says '-juh-' like in juice, jam, jump and jellyfish.



Jam is a fruit spread, usually made by cooking whole fruit with sugar.

The letter 'z' looks a lot like the letter 'i," except that it is longer and curls up on the bottom, almost like it grew a leg and a foot.





Skip these two pages if your child has no problem with the 'j' sound.

The letter 'j' sound is tricky because it mixes TWO sounds:



The "ch" sound, like in...



chicken on a chair



chew a



And the sound that you make in your throat, like when you sing without using words.




