

The letter "W" can be a vowel or a consonant

At the beginning of a word or syllable, the letter "W" is always a consonant.




But when a "W" is in the middle of a word or at the end of a word, it is often a vowel.

For example, to spell the "ow" sound, you put an "O" and a "W" together, and you get, "how now, brown cow?" When this happens, both letters (the "O" and the "W") are vowels because "ow" is one of our vowel sounds.



vowel combination

To help remember this, think of the letter "W" as a very naughty vowel because it always PINCHES the first vowel much too hard. Ow!.



In the English language, "Ow!" is an expression of pain or surprise.



Don went up and down the stairs.

He went up and down all day. Will Don go up and down the stairs until they go away?



How hot is the bath?

As hot as can be.

How hot is the bath?

Too hot for me.



Down with ice cream.

Down with steak.

Down with candy,

cookies and cake.


They all go down to my tummy because they are the foods I love, love, love.

("Wow" means great or wonderful.)




My dog was hungry for some chow. "Not now," I said with a scowl. My dog bit my toe with a great big growl. "Not now!" I said with a howl.

(Chow is food. A scowl is a big frown.)

Sometimes, when the letter "W" pinches the letter "O," the letter "O" calls out its name instead of saying, "Ow."





"Calling out its name" is another way of saying, "making its long vowel sound."

Because this happens a lot — the letter "O" saying "oh" instead of "ow" — try saying a word both ways ("oh" or "ow") if you don't already know the word.




If you throw some snow at me, then I will throw it back. So let us go and play in the snow and have a snow attack.






If I had a cat of my OWN,

The yellow cat in the window has a yellow dot on her chin. And the yellow cat in the window would rather be out than in.


Red is stop,

My Slow Cow is so, so slow. She will not come when I call. My slow cow is so, so slow that she will not move at all.







When the letter pinches the letter "A," it says, "Aw!"



I never saw a newt with a net until I met a newt with a net. The newt tried to catch me with his net. The newt wanted a pet, I bet.




Look at me and my nice,

new net as I catch a






How do you chew a shoe?




I blew a big bubble,

My cat made a pot of stew. I took one bite, and I said, "Eww!"


She made the stew with a dirty shoe and something else that was hard to chew.

In the English language, "Ouch" is an expression of pain, same as "ow."




A clown sat in a cloud.

I found a round clown over there by the wall. The clown ran around on the ground by my feet. I pushed his round nose, and his nose said, "Beep."




We ran around and around the tree.


I did not catch my dog, and he did not catch me.



My dog has a long, long snout. His snout is so long that he has to shout. But the shout is lost in his long, long snout, so a little whisper is all that comes out.




I got out of bed and said with a shout, "Get out, get out of my mouth." And the tooth fairy flew up and away without, without a tooth. Hooray!

It is not allowed to be loud, but no one can hear me on a cloud.


So if I ever live on a cloud, I will be as loud as I allow.




I read a book about

at that point, I gave up.




It was about nine

I found out about a party that was to start at three. But I found out at six o'clock, and by that time, the party had stopped.




I can count from one

rule breakers

Words with "ou" almost always say "ow," but a few words break the rules, such as "you," "soup", "youth" and "group."



A group of fish ate the soup.



This soup is good.

This soup is great.

This soup is the soup
that no one else ate. The


soup is ready for you
to eat if you like soup
that smells like feet.

another rule breaker

The word "touch" also breaks the rule, but makes a different sound than "ouch" or "soup."

vowel combination

When the letter "U" comes after the letter "A," they work together to make the "au" sound. However, the "au" sound can be different in different words.



Chocolate sauce is good to eat.




I was upset because the chocolate sauce was on my head and not in my mouth.
